

SHORELINE WOMEN'S GOLF CLUB
GENERAL MEETING
JUNE 13, 2006

The meeting was called to order by Captain Patti Hayes at 12:50 p.m. at Michael's restaurant.

MINUTES: It was moved/seconded, Robbie Gray/MaryLu Bishop, to dispense with reading of the Minutes.

PWGA: Nancy Humpal encouraged all members to consider playing in the PWGA Mixed Couples Tournament as well as the PWGA play days. Information regarding these various events is kept in the binder, which is available at the Starter's table.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Pat Bocook reported that the May checkbook balance was \$2,339.12. An additional \$1,000 is expected from dues. Since there was no match play this year due to the weather, the Board voted to transfer \$100 from the Match play budget to the Invitational budget.

MEMBERSHIP: Membership has grown this year from 92 to 98 members with one new qualifier and four additional women interested.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE: The nominating committee is composed of two Board members and three at-large members. Patti Hayes and Namie Takatsuka will serve on the committee from the Board and Joyce Bartlett, Dixie Lynch and Vicki Thomas will represent the membership.

AMERICAN EXPRESS WOMEN'S GOLF WEEK:

Shoreline participated in the promotion of women's golf and raised approximately \$1800 for the American Heart Association. This was done with only four volunteers. A very special thanks to Lynn Wheelan, Francie Green, Paulette Wrightson and Patti Hayes for their hard work.

GREENS COMMITTEE: Francie Green will attempt to get handicap flags for use when carts are not allowed on the fairways. An equitable distribution of the red, white and blue flags on the holes will also be pursued.

RULES: The back of the score cards have been updated to reflect the local rules. It was especially noted that stones in bunkers are moveable obstructions and may, therefore, be removed from the bunker. The sprinkler heads and drains around the greens are considered immovable obstructions. If your ball is within two club lengths of these obstructions, you may take a drop at the nearest point of relief, no closer to the hole.

Two or more tees that are attached are nonconforming tees and are considered illegal. The penalty for use of this type of tee is disqualification.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

West Valley topped Shoreline in low gross by 1.5 points this year. Shoreline had previously won low gross the past four years. Santa Clara Fairways won low net.

Entry forms for the Santa Clara County Championship held July 31 and August 1 at San Jose Country Club were distributed. The event is flighted and members were encouraged to participate.

Each member is entitled to bring one guest to Guest Day. The guest must have an established handicap.

Members were reminded to call as early as possible to cancel their tee times. The pro shop has provided us with 11 starting times, and it is essential we meet that commitment as closely as possible. One day there were 21 cancellations.

Please keep your score cards legible as they are often very difficult to read.

The Invitational is August 15th, and a member may bring three guests to make up the foursome.

Starters/Scorers: Kathy Hanson and Vicki Thomas need to know if you have switched with someone. They also need to know if you plan to play on that day.

Palo Alto Municipal is celebrating 50 years of golf and is inviting people to sign up for their two best-ball tournament.

Unless pace of play is an issue, out of courtesy, the first person to finish the hole should pick up the flag.
