

SHORELINE WOMEN'S GOLF CLUB
GENERAL MEETING
MARCH 5, 2007

The meeting was called to order by Captain Marylu Bishop at 1:40 p.m. at Michael's Restaurant.

MINUTES: Secretary Marky Olsen read the minutes of the January 2, 2007 meeting. It was m/s Priest/Hanson to approve the minutes as read.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Lois Sangster reviewed the proposed 2007 budget pointing out that there is an increase to the budget of \$150. It was m/s/ Humpal/Panelli to accept.

PWGA: Nancy Humpal reminded members that part of their Shoreline dues go toward membership in PWGA and encouraged members to peruse the play days and other tournaments listed in the binder located with the Starters/Scorers as well as on the Shoreline and PWGA web sites. Members need to contact Nancy if they are interested in participating in any play days. Other tournament entry forms can be found in the PWGA handbook. Shoreline will continue to be involved in the Susan G. Kolman Breast Cancer charity.

TOURNAMENT: Winter rules will be extended until the bird poop is cleaned up. Players are permitted to lift and clean their balls. There will be a practice match play round on the 20th of March so that players can get a better understanding of the rules.

New score cards with the new ratings for the holes are now being used. The course rating changed from 71 to 71.1; the slope rating stayed the same.

CLOSEST TO THE PIN: There is only one winner so do not put your name on the list if someone else is closer to the pin.

SCORES/STARTERS: If you get a substitute for your scorer/starter duty, be certain you email your partner to let her know. You may be assigned three duties, so please check your assignments carefully.

Arrive early for your tee time in the Winter because many people cancel. You must arrive at least 1/2 hour ahead of your tee time and remember the desk closes at 8:30.

Pace of Play: Play ready golf in order to speed up play. You are given a start time when you tee off and you must check in with the scorer to report your ending time. Do not total your score cards before you report in.

SCORE CARDS: A friendly reminder to complete your score cards legibly with last names first. Post your scores at the golf course, not at home or the scores will get posted twice.

TEE TIMES: It is the Starter/Scorers responsibility to sign up to play if you plan to play that day.

RULES: The only local rule not on the back of the Shoreline score card is the one that states that if a sprinkler head is between the player and the green and the player is within two cub lengths of the sprinkler head, she may take relief from the sprinkler head.

STANDING RULE CHANGE: All potential members must play to a 112 and are not eligible for sweeps until they have qualified. It was m/s/ Panelli/Hanson and unanimously approved.

Donna Alexander reported that there are 63 members on the birdie tree. She also stated that Moffett Field is recruiting women players and would like to start a Thursday ladies club. Green fees are \$20 and a cart is \$10.

If anyone is interested, she should contact Ann Marie Lee.

Frances Green asked if there were concerns about what is happening on the golf course. It was mentioned that some of the maintenance people are interfering with play because they do not seem to be aware that they are in the way of players attempting to make their golf shots. Frances will speak with the pro shop regarding this matter.

Shoreline team play will be held on April 11th and Patti Hayes requested two volunteers to assist with marshaling in order to enforce pace of play.
The volunteers will receive game credit.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:00 p.m.
